RE: Esseltine Drain Extension- Meeting to consider contract price

Report No.: MS 2019 - 50

AIM

To review the construction pricing for the Esseltine Drain Extension pursuant to Section 59 (1) of the Drainage Act in order to award the project to the lowest bidder.

BACKGROUND

In December 2014, the Town of Kingsville initiated the repair and improvement of the Esseltine Drain under Section 78 of the Drainage Act and appointed R.C. Spencer Associates to prepare a report under provisions of the Act. The Esseltine Drain Extension Report (The Report) created by R.C. Spencer Associates is intended to provide for the repair and improvement of the existing municipal drain and to extend the municipal drain to a sufficient outlet.

The Drainage Act requires transparency throughout the entire process. The Act allows for public input through mandatory meetings that must be held in front of Council. The Meeting to Consider is held to allow landowners to question the engineer's design. Council must approve the report before move to the next step of the process.

The Court of Revision which allows landowners to question their assessments as determined by the engineer is the next step in the Drainage Act process. The Court is historically made up of members of Council, however, the Court of Revision is a mandatory meeting separate than a Council meeting. Once adopted by Council a mandatory waiting period is required. If no appeals are submitted than a Third and Final reading is held and a corresponding by-law is passed and the project is allowed to move forward.

The Report was completed and submitted to the Town in December of 2016, and went through the mandatory Meeting to Consider the report, four (4) Court of Revision sittings, three (3) Drainage Tribunal hearing dates and one (1) request to have a Review of the Tribunal decision. Once the final decision of the Tribunal was received the Third and Final Reading to adopt the report occurred. Preparation of the contract documents and specifications to initiate the tendering process began soon thereafter.

DISCUSSION

The tender closing date for the Esseltine Drain Extension project was October 11, 2019 where the tender results were received and analyzed. Three (3) contractors submitted bids of which the lowest bidder had a construction price of \$4,708,655.00. The bids were as follows:

South Shore Contracting of Essex County. \$4,708,655.00 D' Amore Construction (2000) Inc. \$5,210,000.00 Sterling Ridge Infrastructures Inc. \$6,285,690.00

On the attached, Tables 1 and 2 illustrate the assessment comparison between the lowest submitted tendered price (October 2019) and the Engineer's estimate provided in the Report dated June 2016.

A direct cost comparison shows that the lowest tendered price is 136% higher than the original Engineer's estimate. Section 59 (1) of the Drainage Act states that Council shall hold a meeting to consider the contract price if it exceeds 133% of the engineer's estimate.

Section 59 of the Drainage Act states:

59 (1) Where the contract price exceeds 133 per cent of the engineer's estimate of the contract price, the council of the initiating municipality shall call a meeting in the manner prescribed by section 41, and sections 42 and 43 apply with necessary modifications. R.S.O. 1990, c. D.17, s. 59 (1).

It is important to note that it has taken more than three (3) years to reach the tendering process after the engineer prepared the estimate and submitted the report in June 2016. This delay is a result of the public process required for the four (4) sittings of the Court of Revision, the three (3) hearings of the Tribunal and the request to review the Tribunal's decision.

During preparation of the Engineer's estimate prepared in 2016, it is important to note R.C. Spencer Associates reached out to multiple local contractors to confirm the unit prices that were used in the estimate for the Report. The estimate provided for construction within the Report were representative of the market conditions at that time.

Tendering projects at different times of the year may have an impact on contractor's pricing. This project was tendered in the fall to begin construction in the winter of 2020. Considering that most infrastructure projects historically do not usually take place in the wintertime, contractors will generally provide aggressive tender bids at this time of year.

Therefore, it is unlikely that tendering this project at a different time of year would have resulted in lower contract prices.

It is also important to note that as a result of the timing window restrictions imposed by the Department of Fisheries and Oceans for fish species, no in water works are permitted between March 15th and June 30th. As part of the tendering process contractors were required to submit a work schedule. All bidders planned on starting preliminary works in the winter and scheduled in water works to commence in July of 2020 with an estimated completion date of winter 2020.

Throughout the entire design and approval process, multiple design alternatives were considered and evaluated for potential cost savings. The final approved design for this project has been developed to provide the most economical solution that will also provide long term sustainable protection for the Esseltine Drain and adjacent properties.

The estimates provided in the Report for contract administration and inspection services will not be affected as a result of inflation.

LINK TO STRATEGIC PLAN

To become a leader in sustainable infrastructure renewal and development.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS

Inflation to infrastructure costs must be considered when comparing the original estimate to current pricing. Stats Canada shows that since 2016, the infrastructure price index has shown an average increase of 6% per year. When considering inflation the estimate shall be compared as follows:

Inflation from 2016-2019= 6%/year compounded for three (3) years=1.06x3= 19% Original Estimate plus inflation= \$3,461,025x1.19= \$4,118,619.75 Contract Price comparison= \$4,708,655.00 / \$4,118,619.75= 114.3%

Therefore, after considering the inflation that has occurred since the filing of the Report in 2016, the lowest bid is 114% higher than the original estimate.

THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF KINGSVILLE BY-LAW 104-2019

Being a By-law to confirm the proceedings of the Council of The Corporation of the Town of Kingsville at its December 2, 2019 Special Meeting

WHEREAS sections 8 and 9 of the *Municipal Act, 2001* S.O. 2001 c. 25, as amended, (the "Act") provides that a municipality has the capacity, rights, powers and privileges of a natural person for the purpose of exercising the authority conferred upon a municipality to govern its affairs as it considers appropriate.

AND WHEREAS section 5(3) of the Act provides that such power shall be exercised by by-law, unless the municipality is specifically authorized to do so otherwise.

AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient that the proceedings of the Council of The Corporation of the Town of Kingsville (the "Town") be confirmed and adopted by by-law.

NOW THEREFORE THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF KINGSVILLE ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. The actions of the Council at its December 2, 2019 Special Meeting in respect of each report, motion, resolution or other action taken or direction given by the Council at its meeting, is hereby adopted, ratified and confirmed, as if each resolution or other action was adopted, ratified and confirmed by its separate by-law.
- 2. The Chief Administrative Officer and/or the appropriate officers of the Town are hereby authorized and directed to do all things necessary to give effect to the actions set out in paragraph 1, or obtain approvals, where required, and, except where otherwise provided, the Mayor and the Clerk are hereby directed to execute all documents necessary and to affix the corporate seal to all such documents.
- 3. This By-Law comes into force and takes effect on the day of the final passing thereof.
