The Town approved a Traffic Calming Policy in 2016. Per this Policy, "Children at Play" signs are not an effective measure for improved traffic calming. We have not been installing them as a result. Below is an excerpt from the Kingsville Traffic Calming Policy in regards to these signs.

I have provided the following solutions to the resident (Mr. Van Wingerden):

- I requested periodic OPP enforcement of the area.
- · I suggested he utilize the local improvement process to construct sidewalks in order to remove children from the street.
- I asked if he would like me to setup the traffic counter and assess the street for eligibility of any physical traffic calming measures per our Policy. He politely declined. I decided to assess anyways, attached are the results.

Per our Policy, traffic calming isn't warranted. However should calming be warranted, measures others than "Children at Play" signage would be recommended.
