F. NEW AND UNFINISHED BUSINESS

1. Closed Cemeteries Plantings – Carol

The Committee discussed whether to proceed with planting native wildflowers in closed cemeteries. Benefits noted include consistency with CIB's support for creating pollinator habitat, as well as labour saving costs for the Town if the cemeteries no longer require mowing. It was decided to start with one closed cemetery as a pilot project this year, and the Pearl St. cemetery was selected. CIB will sow selected native plant seeds this spring. Species



selected for this project will be low maintenance, self-propagating and of limited height so as not to interfere with the view of the headstones.

Invasive Species Community Education Event

In lieu of a repeat of the May 1, 2022 Year of the Garden event, CIB will hold a one-day Invasive Species Community Education Event on Saturday, May 27, 2023. The location to be confirmed, but Lakeside Pavilion would be the committee's first choice. The focus of the one-day event will be identification and local efforts to control invasive species. Potential topics, speakers and exhibitors to be discussed at the next CIB meeting.

Plant Sale

CIB will help to promote the annual Horticultural Society Plant Sale, which takes place on Saturday May 14, 2023 at the Unico Centre. CIB will ask them for a table at the plant sale.

Adopt a Trail

Thomas reported that there were three sections of the Greenway in town that are available for interested groups to adopt for a two year period, i.e. to gather trash several times per year. The committee chose Section CCG-17 which runs from Lansdowne to Park St.

Sacred Healing Garden

As an alternative to the *Walkways of Sacred Teachings* joint project between the Town and Caldwell First Nation that was originally proposed for the area in front of the Carnegie Building last year, the Committee will investigate the potential for establishing a Sacred Healing Garden at Lakeside Park. The garden project would be undertaken in partnership with Caldwell First Nation, and would feature local plants used in traditional medicine practices. The plants would be labelled with identification signage and QR codes to scan for further information about their traditional uses.

 ACTION – Heather will investigate whether there is interest on the part of Caldwell First Nation to undertake a project of this nature.
