The primary focus of this inspection was to confirm compliance with Ministry of the Environment, Conservation and Parks (MECP) legislation as well as evaluating conformance with ministry drinking water policies and guidelines during the inspection period. The ministry utilizes a comprehensive, multi-barrier approach in the inspection of water systems that focuses on the source, treatment, and distribution components as well as management practices.

This drinking water system is subject to the legislative requirements of the Safe Drinking Water Act, 2002 (SDWA) and regulations made therein, including Ontario Regulation 170/03, "Drinking Water Systems" (O. Reg. 170/03). This inspection has been conducted pursuant to Section 81 of the SDWA.

Haloacetic acid samples were collected at SS-K-14, a Kingsville sampling station near the end of the Kingsville Distribution System. Haloacetic acids generally form at the beginning of the distribution system and therefore, samples to be analyzed for haloacetic acids should be collected near the beginning of the distribution system, not near the end of it.

HAA sampling was done each calendar quarter, specifically on October 3, 2022, January 4, 2023, April 3, 2023 and July 4, 2023. The Running Annual Average was 7.8 ug/L.

Errors in one logbook were heavily crossed out and not initialed.

Section 27 of O. Reg. 128/04 requires that logbooks must identify all operators on duty for the shift. Logs must also include:

- 1) the date,
- 2) the time period the shift covered and the number or designation of the shift,
- 3) the names of all operators on duty during each shift,
- 4) details of departures from normal operating procedures that occurred during the shift, the time they occurred and the name of the person who gave the instructions for the departure,
- 5) abnormal and unusual observations and related conclusions and/or actions taken,
- 6) a record of equipment taken out of service or ceased to operate, maintenance or repair carried out on the equipment, including the date and time when equipment was repaired and returned to service.
