## A. CALL TO ORDER

### C. ORDER OF BUSINESS

## 1. Process for new projects

CIB as a committee creates a project plan that includes purpose, the rationale for doing the project, the process to complete, which could consist of community consultation, resources needed (contractors, volunteers, Town staff), budget (fundraising, money from Council, labour paid, volunteer, Town staff), and a sustainability plan. The project plan should be given to the staff support, and it will be reviewed internally. Depending on the project scope and impact on staff, it may be approved, or the Committee will be asked to present to Council to assess the project priority compared to other Municipal priorities.

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## 2. Naturalization Project

- Some existing gardens could be naturalized, which would reduce the time for maintenance.
- A new volunteer weeding program is being created that CIB could be involved in.
- The Native Pollinator Garden at Lakeside, located by the Pavilion's front door, needs to be refreshed.
- Ruthven's ERCA project would be completed in phases over the years. If the
  committee is interested, the administration recommends creating a project
  proposal. If approved by Council the Finance Department can support by acting as
  the banker, providing donation receipts, and hosting information on a webpage.
- Other ideas suggested,
- Locations that may encourage native species,
- Lion's Park raised beds, or,
- York Park at the back, closest to the fence.
